



Minutes of the CSDA Board of Directors
Thursday, June 4, 2020

Virtual Videoconference Meeting

CALL TO ORDER - The meeting was called to order by President Matthew Finnigan at 2:03 PM on Thursday, June 4, 2020. The CSDA Executive Director, Erin O'Brien, recorded the minutes.

OPENING REMARKS – Matthew Finnigan welcomed everyone to the meeting. Video conferencing etiquette was reviewed, and all guests were asked to state their name and company.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES - Motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes of the April 1, 2020 Board meeting as written. Motion was passed by unanimous vote.

TREASURER'S REPORT – Kellie Kimball presented the Treasurer's Report for the period ending May 31, 2020. Kimball stated that the Finance committee was still working on the 2020 budget and would be holding a meeting soon to finalize it and begin work on the 2021 budget.

BUSINESS OF THE MEETING

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Erin O'Brien presented the CSDA Executive Director's Report covering current membership status, new members, training, safety, standards and specifications, *Concrete Openings* magazine/website, exhibitions, related associations, annual conventions, public relations activities, promotional materials, CSDA website, social networks and future meetings. The CSDA Executive Director's Report is attached.

CERTIFICATION COMMITTEE

Doug Walker presented the committee report. There are no new certified companies since the last meeting. The committee made phone calls to several non-certified members to find out why they were not certified. Most stated they did not know the program existed, they did not see the benefit or they did not have the time to fill out the application.

A new marketing campaign to get companies certified will commence in the fall and the application will be converted to a fillable PDF form to allow for easier application.

CONVENTION COMMITTEE

Kevin Baron was not present for the meeting and the report echoed what was stated in the Executive Director's report, so no committee report was needed.

ELECTION COMMITTEE

Donna Harris presented the committee report and reminded 2020 Board candidates to submit their Board applications or Lifetime Achievement Award nominations by the June 30 deadline.

Since the 2020 Convention was cancelled, and Tim Beckman was to receive the Lifetime Achievement Award at that event, it was decided to honor Beckman with the award at the 2021 Convention & Tech Fair in Bermuda. The committee will wait until the nomination deadline to decide if they will honor another recipient in 2021.

GPR IMAGING COMMITTEE

Mark DeSchepper presented the committee report. The new Best Practice on operating on and around GPR-scanned concrete slabs and structures was finalized and submitted to the Standards & Specifications committee for final review.

MANUFACTURER COMMITTEE

Scott Brown presented the committee report. The 101 classes to be held in Olathe, KS at the Husqvarna training facility will go forward as planned. A minimum of 10 students will be required to register for the class at least 30 days prior to the start date. If 10 or more students are not signed up by Friday, September 11, the classes will be cancelled.

The 201 Operator Certification classes at St. Petersburg College are also moving forward as planned. The GPR Certification class date and location has yet to be decided.

The equipment lottery list was again reviewed and will be discussed with the two instructors. The committee will then review assignments at the September meeting to be ready for the November Operator Certification course. The Tech Talk assignments were updated.

Western Saw and Diamond Vantage volunteered to donate items for the 2021 World of Concrete raffle. Any other interested manufacturers should contact Scott Brown. Committee members were asked about their interest in forming a "concrete renovation and demolition/diamond tool" pavilion at the World of Concrete for the indoor booths. This pavilion would be open to any member who wished to participate but would not be required. There were

no objections to this idea, so Erin O'Brien will work with Informa staff on a proposal for the 2022 World of Concrete show.

The committee set two goals for 2020: increase contractor membership in CSDA and participation in meetings and training classes. The committee will also plan to include a Zoom element in their in-person meetings in the future for those who cannot attend.

MARKETING COMMITTEE

Jami Harmon presented the committee report. The committee continues to work on updating the Diamond Advantage presentation with new graphics, photos and a more modern look. The template is available for review and anyone who has images or information to submit should contact Jami. The committee's goal is to have the updated presentation ready by the September meeting.

Advertising in the June issue of *Concrete Openings* was discussed, as some advertisers had considered pulling their ads due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Only two full page ads were pulled, along with two smaller ads. One full page ad was moved to run later in the year. In response to the decreased in expected advertising income, the page count for this issue was decreased to save money, as well as limiting the number of international prospect recipients.

CSDA will shift its booth to the new West Hall for World of Concrete 2021, in order to stay close to as many other member exhibitors as possible. A diamond tool/concrete renovation and demolition pavilion is being discussed with Informa, the show organizers for World of Concrete, for the 2022 show.

The committee set two goals for 2020: (1) complete the updates for the Diamond Advantage presentation and (2) finalize a job description and plan for hiring the Market Development position.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

Dan Dennison presented the committee report. The original membership dues deadline was extended to June 1, 2020 due to the pandemic to allow for members to better assess their financial situation. The decision was made to extend it further to June 15, with CSDA sending thank you letters to those that have already renewed and reminders to those who haven't. We will work with any member who cannot afford to pay their dues but would like to retain membership. A follow-up meeting will be held on June 15 to evaluate what has happened since.

The committee would like to continue their proactive outreach approach, so members do not feel like they are only being contacted when dues are due.

NEXT GENERATION COMMITTEE

Bill Fisher presented the committee report. The committee stated three goals for the year. One is to shift the calendar of events from 2020 to 2021. The second is to repeat the World of Concrete networking reception, but in a different location to a more intimate environment and allowing the event to be more inclusive. A third goal is to use social media to promote the benefits of being a CSDA member. This will be done using short job story highlights and promoting all the disciplines that CSDA contractors offer: cutting, demolition, GPR, polishing

and recycling. Committee members will also compile a list of five member benefits that can be used to develop additional marketing materials.

POLISHING COMMITTEE

Bruce Ferrell presented the committee report. The testing that was being performed to contribute data to the CSDA-ST-118 updated Standard was temporarily put on hold, due to the loss of access to the slab being used for testing. Superabrasive near Atlanta has volunteered a slab at their facility so testing will resume this summer.

The committee would like to wait for ACI/ASCC to publish their new specification before the committee reviews and updates the CSDA polishing standards, specifications and best practices.

SAFETY COMMITTEE

Bennett Jones presented the committee report. The committee did not have a chance to meet prior to the Board meeting but has committed to focus on revising the safety videos that need updating. Erin O'Brien will send the videos to those who had previously volunteered to review the content.

STANDARDS & SPECIFICATIONS COMMITTEE

Mike Orzechowski presented the committee report. The committee has released one new and five revised documents since the last meeting. The new document is a Best Practice for GPR, *CSDA-BP-026 Operating in Scanned Slabs*. Updated documents include: *CSDA-BP-002 Equipment Maintenance Management for Contractors*, *CSDA-BP-006 Hydraulic Cutting Equipment*, *CSDA-BP-007 Ground Penetrating Radar*, *CSDA-ST-107 Blade Application Code and CSDA-C-101 Core Drilling*.

The committee's goal is to review and update all 43 documents by the 2021 Convention.

TRAINING COMMITTEE

Patrick Harris presented the committee report.

Texas Cutting & Coring requested a site-specific course for GPR Certification to be held at their Round Rock, TX facility. The committee is working on a proposal and dates.

The job descriptions and agreements for trainers are being reviewed and finalized by the committee. Work continues on the new Cutting Edge online course. A final draft is being circulated around the committee for comments. The committee hopes to have this project completed by July.

Patrick Harris and Rick Norland will work on reviewing the course tests to ensure duplicate questions have been removed prior to the fall training classes.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

There was no unfinished business.

NEW BUSINESS

Dan Dennison reported that this would be his last Board meeting. Dennison has accepted a position with a company in another industry and would no longer be able to be involved in CSDA. He thanked all the Board members for their support and friendship over the years.

NEXT MEETING - The next meeting of the CSDA Board of Directors will be held on September 23, 2020 in Scottsdale, AZ at the Westin Kierland Resort.

ADJOURNMENT - There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:12 PM.

Training Update

- Digital Lagoon continues to work with CSDA to update the online Cutting Edge webinar. Video was shot during the Operator Certification courses in Clearwater in November, and footage was sent to the committee in February for review. After the completion of Cutting Edge, the new web-based training website will be built, and all online training classes will shift over to the new site.
- Dates are set for the Fall 2020 Training Program. The 101 classes will be held at the new Husqvarna Training Facility in Olathe, KS from October 12-16, 2020 while the 201 Operator Certification courses will again be held at the CSDA training facility at St. Petersburg College in Clearwater, FL. These classes will be held November 2-6, 2020.
- A GPR Certification site-specific class to be held at Texas Cutting and Coring in Round Rock, Texas is under consideration.
- The CSDA online training website continues to be popular. To date, 1,292 users (+1% since the March 2020 Board meeting) with 257 (+1%) companies have taken 8,388 exams (+1%). CSDA has now received \$75,541 (+1%) for its portion of the registration fees since January 2007.

2. Safety Handbook / Safety Manual

- A total of 6,835 CSDA Safety Handbooks (original + English/Spanish) have been sold since introduction in January 2000, with 1 sold since the April 2020 meeting.
- Sales of the CSDA Safety Manual continue, with 271 copies of the print and electronic versions sold since its introduction. No Safety Manuals have been sold since the April 2020 meeting.

3. Standards & Specifications

- Four revised standard and specifications documents were updated by the committee since the April meeting and have been approved for release. They are: Specification CSDA-C-101 Core Drilling, Standard CSDA-BC-107 Blade Application Code for Diamond Saw Blades, Best Practice CSDA BP-002 Equipment Maintenance Management for Contractors and Best Practice CSDA-BP-006 Hydraulic Cutting Equipment. All of these updated documents can be found on the CSDA website.

- The number of paid ad pages for the June 2020 issue is down 1.1 pages from the June 2019 issue. This decrease is attributed to reduced advertising efforts and budgets due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The percentage of ad pages to total pages is targeted at a maximum of 35 percent. The ad-to-page percentage for the June issue was at 22 percent, leaving room for additional advertisers and larger ads.

2. Concrete Openings Highlights

- The June issue of *Concrete Openings* contains three CSDA contractor job stories:
 - Wire and slab sawing of a 60-year old bridge in Yuba City, CA.
 - Core drilling of nearly 5,000 holes at a wind farm in south Texas.
 - Slab sawing of a historical building in downtown Chicago, IL.
- Additional sections include safety, business, tech and health-related articles, industry news and a CSDA membership testimonial from Skip Aston of Ohio Concrete Sawing and Drilling of Sylvania, OH.
- Free *Concrete Openings* subscription forms continue to be received through the *Concrete Openings* website. A total of 10 new print subscriptions have been received through the current website since March 2020 (up 5%), bringing the total to 3,260 since the website went live in March 2015.

3. Concrete Openings Website

- The *Concrete Openings* website features current and archived issues up to the March 2020 issue.
- The website had 5,430 page views since March 2020 (-21%), and 14,930 (+4%) total page views since its launch in March 2015.
- There were 1,511 visitors since March 2020 (-17%) for a 4-year total of 24,240 (+7%) unique visitors.

Exhibitions

- An aggressive marketing campaign was conducted to promote CSDA's source code A26 for the World of Concrete. The code saved any attendee up to \$70 per registration by offering discounted \$25 registration until January 17th.
- The usual springtime co-sponsor meeting was cancelled due to COVID-19, but co-sponsors were notified of their rebate amount in late May. CSDA received a record-setting rebate in the amount of \$68,929.84 (up 68% from 2019) with 1,579 verified registrations of attendees using CSDA's source code A26. This rebate amount placed CSDA 2nd out of 18 co-sponsor associations, many who are much larger than CSDA with larger support staff. This rebate amount means that for each person using CSDA's unique source code A26, CSDA received about \$40 per registration. The rebate amount is calculated based on verified registrations, booth space, years as a co-sponsor association and events held at the show. CSDA will increase its marketing efforts for the 2021 World of Concrete show, which will be held January 19-22 in Las Vegas and will be moving its booth to the brand new West Hall.
- CSDA is endorsing the following future exhibitions and conferences:
 - Concrete Show South America 2020*, August 19-21, Sao Paulo, Brazil
 - Concrete Show South East Asia 2020*, September 18-20 in Jakarta, Indonesia
 - IACDS 25th Annual Convention*, September 24-25, 2020 in Stockholm, Sweden
 - World of Concrete 2021*, January 18-22 in Las Vegas, NV
 - BuildTech Asia 2021*, March 10-12 in Singapore

Related Associations

- The International Association of Concrete Drillers and Sawers (IACDS) announced that their 25th Anniversary Annual Convention was postponed to later in the year due to COVID-19. It will now take place in Stockholm, Sweden along with DEMCON 2020 from September 24-25, 2020.

Annual Conventions

- The 2020 CSDA Convention & Tech Fair scheduled for March 31 – April 4 at the Omni La Costa in Carlsbad, CA was cancelled due to the global COVID-19 pandemic. This marks the first time in 48 years that CSDA has cancelled a meeting or convention.
- Before it's postponement, there were 142 attendees registered for the 2020 Convention. Attendees were given the choice to receive a refund or apply their registration fees towards next year's event.
- The 2021 CSDA Convention & Tech Fair will be held in Bermuda at the Hamilton Princess Bermuda, March 2-6. Competitive room rates were secured starting at \$259/night.
- The committee is beginning to discuss plans for the 2022 Convention, which will celebrate CSDA's 50th Anniversary. Hawaii has been selected as the location for this event, and proposals have been requested and received. A planned site visit for April 2020 was postponed until November.

World of Concrete 2021 Meeting and Training Schedule
